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Behaviour policy statement

Holiday club encourages and supports children to ensure they have a positive experience while with us. We aim to encourage a positive attitude in the children. Staff will value each child's efforts and interests and encourage confidence and self esteem. Assume the best from all children.

Behaviour management

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- 5. If, once removed from situation, the child's behaviour escalates then the parents will be contacted by the designated leader.
- 6. The child will be given opportunity to apologise, as would a leader if they had said/ acted inappropriately, however an apology should not be forced from them as this will not be sincere and can convey the wrong message.
- 7. Leaders are to be consistent and fair in dealing with inappropriate behaviour.
- 8. Leaders must communicate with others on the team and must inform the designated holiday club leader. Only the designated holiday club leader will discuss behaviour with a child's parents
- 9. If a group of children are presenting with behaviour which challenges, they may be directed to separate activities or given the option of some time out. Leaders will be careful not to take sides in arguments and to facilitate opportunities to resolve any conflict in a more positive way.
- 10. No child will be excluded from holiday club unless their behaviour seriously endangers themselves, others or property or it is impractical to provide safe space and supervision for time out. In this case parents/carers will be asked to keep them at home for one session, to accompany their child to the holiday club, to bring them for a shorter session, or to complete a behaviour contract which specifically identifies the change in behaviour needed for the child to be a 9.2() (3.7), 9(0).4(be).2(
